

Lecturer – Pharmacy Practice

The College of Pharmacy and Nutrition invites applications from qualified individuals for a full-time Lecturer in the Division of Pharmacy. The successful candidate will teach in the PharmD program, primarily in the area of practice skills and patient care, both within the classroom and simulation lab. Further responsibilities include some course coordination, and teaching of various pharmacotherapy topics in the PharmD program. The successful candidate will also be expected to maintain a clinical practice equivalent to approximately 10% of their time, preferably in a community pharmacy setting.

The University of Saskatchewan's main campus is situated on Treaty 6 Territory and the Homeland of the Métis. The University of Saskatchewan is located in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, a city with a diverse and thriving economic base, a vibrant arts community and a full range of leisure opportunities. Qualifications

A minimum of a Bachelor's degree in pharmacy or an entry-to-practice PharmD is required. To qualify, the candidate must be a licensed pharmacist in Saskatchewan by the Saskatchewan College of Pharmacy Professionals. Pharmacists who possess a current license in another Canadian province are eligible if they can obtain their Saskatchewan pharmacist license within 6 months of appointment date. We seek a candidate who has effective teaching, interpersonal, and communication skills. Preference will be given to candidates with previous relevant teaching and clinical experience.

The salary band for a Lecturer position is \$77,613 to \$115,245. Pay will be commensurate on experience. This position includes a comprehensive benefits package which includes a dental, health and extended vision care plan; pension plan, life insurance (compulsory and voluntary), academic long term disability, sick leave, travel insurance, death benefits, an employee assistance program, a professional expense allowance, and a flexible health and wellness spending program.
